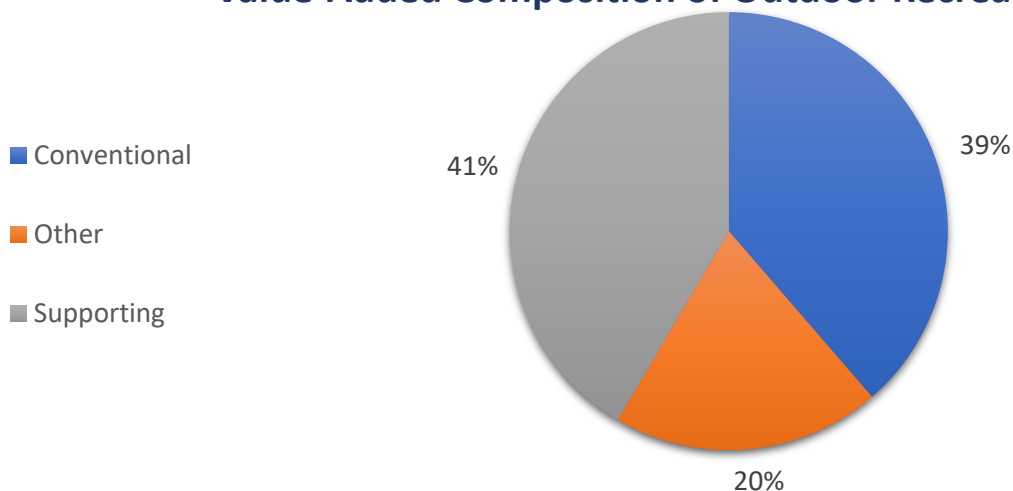

Conventional ORSA activities include traditional outdoor activities, such as camping, hiking, boating, and hunting.

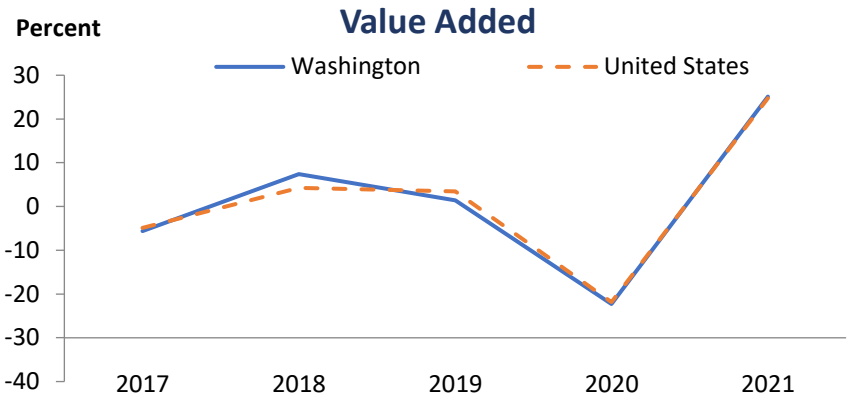
Other ORSA activities include those that take place outside, such as gardening and outdoor concerts.

Supporting ORSA activities are those that contribute to the core activities and include such things as construction, travel and tourism, local trips, and government expenditures.

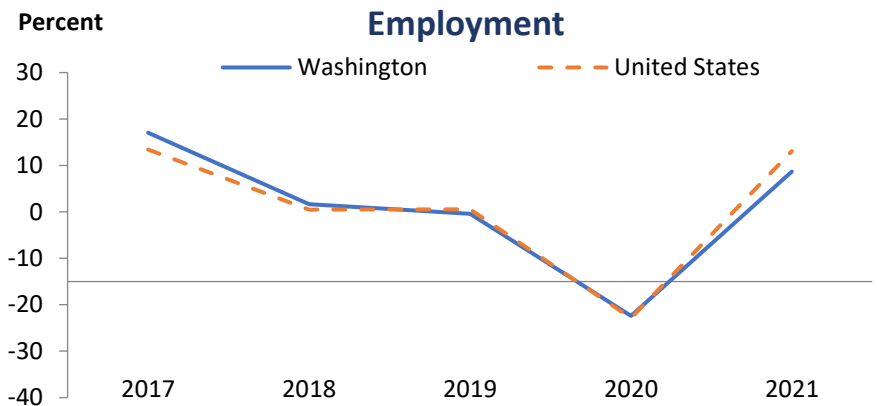

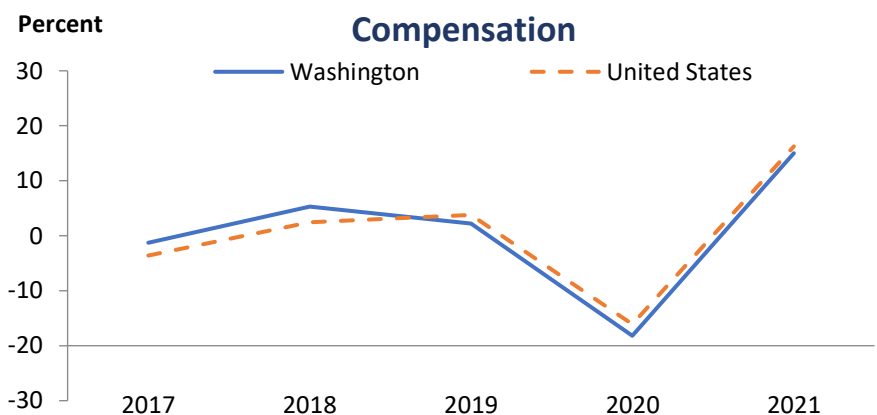
In 2021, Washington ranked 10th among all states in ORSA value added and 22nd among all states in ORSA value-added growth. Since 2020, ORSA value added has grown 25.1 percent in Washington, compared with an increase of 24.7 percent for the United States.



In 2021, Washington ranked 11th among all states in ORSA employment and 49th among all states in ORSA employment growth. Since 2020, ORSA employment has grown 8.7 percent in Washington, compared with an increase of 13.1 percent for the United States.



In 2021, Washington ranked 9th among all states in ORSA compensation and 31st among all states in ORSA compensation growth. Since 2020, ORSA compensation has grown 15 percent in Washington, compared with an increase of 16.2 percent for the United States. Average compensation per wage-and-salary job in Washington ORSA industries was \$54,915 in 2021, compared with \$98,183 for all salaried jobs in the state.



ORSA value added consists of the gross output of an industry less its intermediate inputs; the contribution of an industry to gross domestic product.

ORSA employment consists of all wage-and-salary jobs in which workers are engaged in the production of ORSA goods and services.

ORSA compensation consists of the remuneration (including wages and salaries as well as benefits, such as employer contributions to pension and health funds) payable to employees in return for their ORSA work during a given year.
