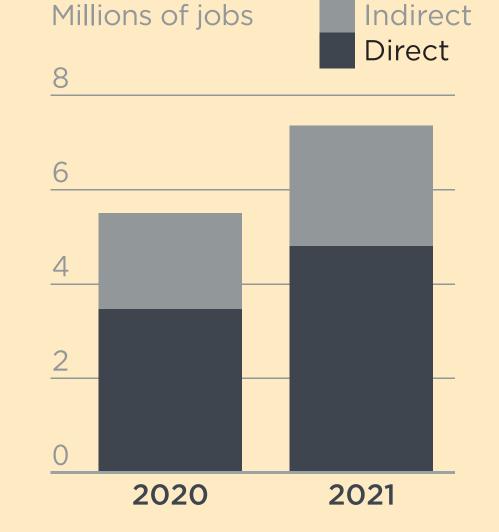
Tourism value added to GDP in 2021

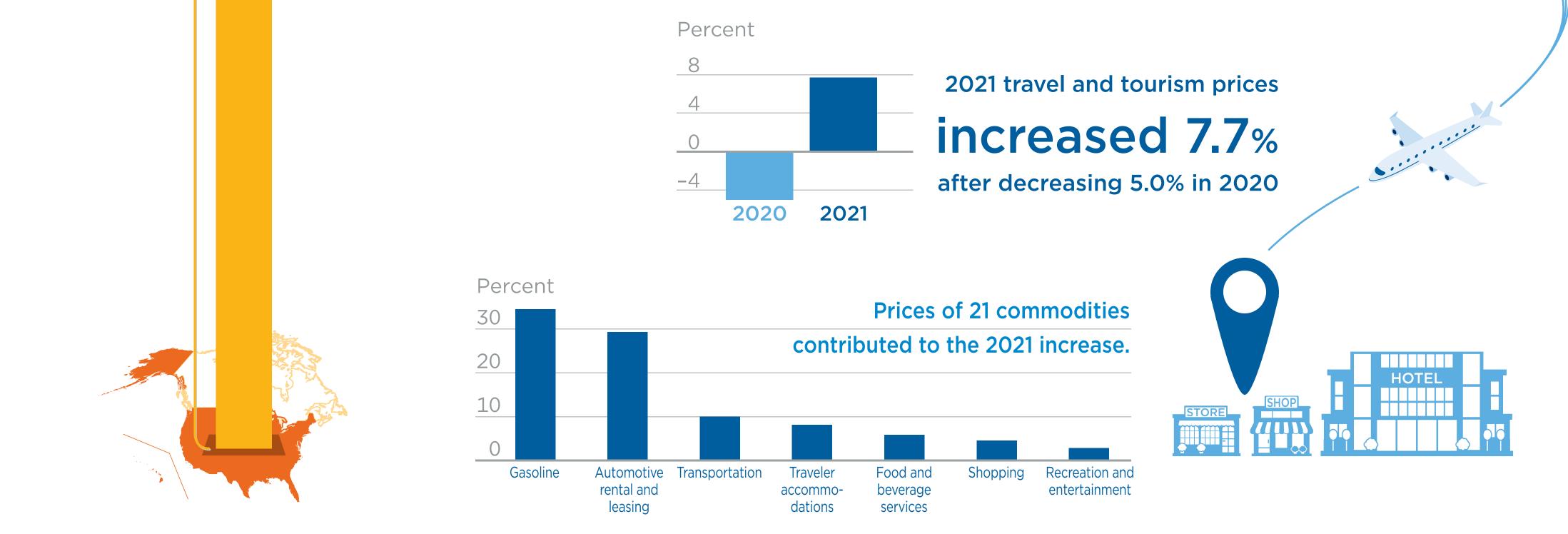


2021 total tourism employment increased **7.4 million jobs**

Data for 2021 indicate that for every 100 jobs supported directly by the travel and tourism industry, an additional 53 indirect tourism jobs are required.
